God's Amazing Grace

We have just celebrated Easter. On Calvary that day were two crosses alongside Jesus' cross. Each cross has a story.

The thieves on either side of Jesus begin their day along with the crowd, cursing Jesus. As the hours past however, one sensed the difference between Jesus and those raising their voices against him. He heard Jesus ask the father to forgive those who were killing him. That produced thoughts that were unthinkable to him, thoughts like forgiveness. Could there be such a thing for him? If

forgiveness was possible, he wanted it, and if anyone could give it, this rabbi was probably the one. So he prayed, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." (Luke 23:42)

The lessons in the story are many. How far can one go in sin and still find forgiveness? How far from the church and its normal ministries can one be, and still become a recipient of grace? How late can one wait before the hope of Christ's pardon is gone?

This story makes it clear that no one, no matter how far from God, is beyond the reach of the love of Christ. Thank God for that thief's cross as well as for Christ's cross. Thanks indeed, for amazing grace.

Praying is a common theme in the Bible. In the Old Testament, we see the prophets, David, Moses, Solomon and others praying to God. In the New Testament, we read how Jesus is constantly going off alone to pray. He even took the time to show his disciples how to pray. Many are familiar with the Lord's Prayer, Matthew 6: 9-13.

The Lord desires a close relationship with every person. Our prayers allow us the opportunity to talk one on one with God. We encourage everyone to read their Bible and take time give your fears, worries, sorrows over to the Lord through prayer. Believers who accept Jesus as their Savior will spend eternity with Him. Begin today to develop a closer relationship.

If you are not already, we strongly encourage you to consider beginning each day with your prayers and your Bible readings. Even before you look at your phone, pick up your Bible and pray. Personally, if I even peak at my phone, I have suddenly lost 45 minutes or more of my quality time with God. As the Bible says, we are to give our firstfruits to the Lord. So maybe we should also give the Lord our first thoughts and time to Him who created us.

PRAY and ACTS are two acronyms that provide an approach for how to pray:

- P Praise God and give Him all glory
- **R** Repent of any wrongdoing/sin in your life
- A Ask God for the help you want
- Y- Yield to God and have faith that in His perfect time, according to His perfect plan, He will answer your prayer.
- A Adoration Begin with adoration/worship of God our Creator
- C Contrition Acknowledge your sins and repent
- T Thanksgiving Give thanks to God for the blessings He has given to you
- S Supplication Ask God for His help in meeting your needs

Prayer Journal Challenge:

Take a notebook and start writing your prayers. Simply enter the date and the specific prayer request. Periodically take time to review your prayer journal and mark off the answered prayers. Do this for 30 days and see how your prayer life changes.

FLORIDA METHODIST CHILDREN'S HOME IS NOW – "RESIDING HOPE"


The Florida United Methodist Children's Home was first established in 1908 as the Florida Methodist Orphanage. Since that time it has grown into an organization serving abused, abandoned, and neglected children from across the state of Florida. In addition to providing

a higher level of therapeutic residential care in two locations, they also provide foster care and outpatient counseling in multiple counties.

They realized that they had outgrown the Children's Home name, and needed something that better represented the purpose they serve and the care they provide. That new name is **Residing Hope**.

The word hope is commonly used to mean a wish or desire. But in the Bible, hope is the confident expectation of what God has promised and the strength of His faithfulness. Residing Hope expresses optimism and the opportunity of a better life of the children and youth they serve. It's that compassionate care that drives everything they do across all of their services and locations.


