Advent Wreath



Christmas is the celebration of the birth of Jesus Christ. Churches begin looking forward to his birth by lighting candles in the four weeks leading up to his birth on December 25. The name for this time of year is **Advent**. Advent means "coming". This year Advent begins on November 29, 2020.

Lighting candles during Advent helps us focus each week on the coming celebration of Jesus's birth on Christmas. Some churches have identified a different characteristic with each candle to help focus on their thanksgivings as they await the birth of Jesus.

The first candle, which is purple, symbolizes *Rope*. Its nickname is the "Prophecy Candle" in remembrance of the prophets, especially Isaiah, who foretold the birth of Christ. It represents the expectation felt in anticipation of the coming Messiah. The color purple is associated with royalty. (*Reflection – Think of the hope we have in the coming of the Lord. Remember the Angel's visit to Mary; walk with Mary this week as we prepare with her for the coming of our Savior*)

The second candle, also purple, represents **faits**. Its nickname is the "Bethlehem Candle" as a reminder of Mary and Joseph's journey to Bethlehem. (Reflection – Think of Joseph; How he obeyed God and followed what God asked him to do)

The third candle, **Joy**, is also called the "Shepard's Candle," and is pink because rose is a liturgical color for joy. It represents the joy the shepherds had when they received the news of Jesus's birth. (Reflection – As we journey through Advent, emptying ourselves of the extra and unneeded, opening ourselves and allowing Jesus to fill us)

On the fourth week of Advent, we light the final purple candle to mark the final week of prayer and penance as we wait for the birth of our Savior. This final candle, the "Angel's Candle," symbolizes Peace. (Reflection – Think about the peace that comes from repentance freeing us to embrace our Lord and Savior)

Some churches include a fifth candle, the *christ candle* or the Christmas Candle. It is white in color and represents the pure and sinless nature of Jesus. The *Light of the World* is here! *ReJOJCe!* Reflection -

Pray for the grace to bring this Christmas miracle into every aspect of your life.



Advent displays are composed of evergreens and candles.

Components generally used are:

Laurel - signifies victory over persecution and suffering.

Pine, Rolly, and yew signify immortality and
Cedar signifies strength and healing.

Advent displays designed around a wreath of greenery remind us of both:

The immortality of our souls

God's promise of everlasting life to us through Christ.



Create your own Advent display by coloring the greenery and making

the candles. Items needed:

5 toilet paper rolls

Scotch tape/glue, scissors,

crayons or coloring Pencils and

Paper to make candles


Advent Wreath Candle Instructions

Use the template to cut out 4 candles. The fourth candle "Christ Candle" should be an inch taller than the other four.

Color the candles the appropriate color (3 purple), (1 pink) and (1 white)

Add the words vertically under the flame

Bend the flames down into the paper roll until the week when you raise it as a lit flame



Use this template to create a flame on each candle wrapper.

Wrap the candle wrapper around the toilet paper roll and fold the flame into the center of the candle.

To "light the candle" you simply raise the yellow flame from the center of the tube.






