Three Crosses

We have just celebrated Easter, and all that it represents. But the cross of Christ, though Central, never stands alone. That day there were three crosses on that hill and that was no accident.

• On one cross was a criminal, who cried out to Jesus for forgiveness.

• On the other cross was a poor soul who tried to find some relief by cursing Jesus. He added his voice to those who taunted and mocked the Lord. This was one for whom Jesus was giving his life.

The lesson for us to learn here is how close a person can be to Jesus, and still miss Him. This thief could not have been more than a few feet away from Him. He undoubtedly heard every whisper that came from the lips of Jesus. God had brought Jesus this close to the thief, so the thief might make peace with Him, but instead he cursed Him.

It is possible to be this close to Christ and still miss Him. One of the disciples missed Him. One could be in church and miss Him. John Wesley did until he was 35 years of age. The tragedy of human history is that many who are closest to Christ miss Him.

He is closer than you think. We must not miss Him.

The Russell—Knudsen Family

Families that make a difference in a community are often headed by mothers who built a strong foundation of love, responsibility, generosity, faith. The Russell - Knudsen family is the perfect example of a family of mothers who impacted the children they raised as well as our church and our community.

Consider all the special mothers in that family tree! Let's start with Virginia!

Virginia Russell Hollowell: One absolute gem of a lady and as grand as a mother could be: mother of Rich and Juanita Russell Knudsen. Was her strength, love and determination a result of her own childhood and the tragedies she overcame in her life? Her dad died of spinal meningitis when she was six; her mom died a year later from the same disease. Virginia spent the next ten years in an orphanage. She married Warren "Bones" Russell in 1947 and then moved to the Florida Keys. She lost an infant son in 1955. Then they lost the family home to Hurricane Donna in 1960, and to a fire in 1967. In 1973, Bones died of lung cancer. She explained that it was her faith in Jesus that provided strength, comfort, and healing for each challenge. Virginia died May 11, 2007, shortly before Mother's Day that year. <u>Click</u>


Florida Keys Children's Shelter—Local outreach program

Barbara Haudenshield's Corn Pudding

- 1 can of creamed corn
- 1 can of whole kernel corn, drained except For 1/2 cup of liquid 8 oz. of sour cream
- 1 egg
- 1 stick of butter
- 1 teas. sugar
- 1 box of Jiffy corn muffin mix

Dash of salt

Mix all together in 1 1/2 qt. Casserole.

Sue Miller's Cabbage Noodle Bake

1 medium cabbage, shredded
8 ounces of noodles
½ pound bacon, well done, crumbled
1 can condensed cream of chicken soup
½ cup butter, melted
2 cups Swiss cheese grated

Boil noodles and cabbage until done, approximately 11 – 12 minutes
Combine with bacon, soup and butter
Place in 9 x 11 baking dish
Top with cheese
Bake at 350 degrees for 30 minutes
