

Pastor Tony

When the Paveys take time off, retired Pastor Tony Hammon sometimes fills in for Pastor Bob.. So just who is Tony Hammon? Hammon spent much of his youth in Islamorada. In fact he wrote a book about his early broken life, his family, and the impact it had on him: **Bone of My Bone: Journey to Reconciliation.**

He graduated from Coral Shores High School and then came back to town a few years later to teach marine biology at the local high school. But soon he learned what his real calling would be: a lifelong journey in Christian education.

Hammon founded Island Christian in 1973 and has worn multiple hats as an pastor, educator, principal, coach, superintendent and so much more. He retired a couple years ago but seems just as busy as ever doing important mission work.

President of the Matecumbe United Methodist Church Council, Rich Russell, has known Tony Hammon most of his life. In fact he was one of Hammon's students at Coral Shores. Over the years, Russell reports that Tony Hammon's messages during his Sunday sermons were often the inspiration for the lyrics of some of the inspirational song lyrics that have made us love Rich's musical compositions.

"Tony is an icon in this community," Russell said. "He was not just Island Christian's pastor, but in a larger sense, he was this community's pastor for so many decades."

Tony was a member of MUMC in his youth. We are all happy to see him return when the Paveys are out of town. Thank you Pastor Tony.

Rich Russell is the great-great grandson of Islamorada's original settlers, Richard H. and Mary Ann Russell. A 1975 graduate of Coral Shores High School, he has been an educator and coach from 1979 until he retired from that a few years back, but continues to serve as athletic director.

His is a graduate of the University of Miami, where he was on a football scholarship and remains a vocal UM alum! He is owner of First Family Rental and RCR Enterprises (lobster and stone crab business). He wrote music and for a number of years, sang in the Island Quartet, a Southern Gospel Quartet that thrilled audiences with their amazing sounds and refreshing humor. Mr. Russell has been

involved in local Village government citizen committees; co-founded the Upper Keys Foundation (a not-for-profit underwriting athletic expenses at Coral Shores) and is President of the Board of the Florida Keys History and Discovery Center. It is always a special treat when Rich sings a song he wrote during a Sunday church service.
